

Parent-Guardian Orientation Evening



HSC Results 2015



The School congratulates our 2015 HSC cohort for their magnificent performance and what brilliant results they were. The HSC School Dux is Zhiwang Lee (also known as Lancelot) with an ATAR of 99.25. This is a remarkable achievement by him and he has set a wonderful

foundation for our future Year 12 students to surpass. I wish all the students well for the future and may they prosper with their tertiary studies.

Zhiwang Li's specific achievements were a Band 6 in ESL, Chemistry, Mathematics Ext 1 & 2, and Japanese Beginners.

Congratulations to Mr Alexandru on the phenomenal Mathematics results. We are truly fortunate to have a teacher of Mr Alexandru's calibre.

Below are some further notable statistics:

- 1. School Ranked 77th in the state
 - (Daily Telegraph 16 December 2016)

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- 2. Ranked 10^{th} on the Maths Merit List for Ext 1 & 2
- 3. 8% of students attained an ATAR over 95
- 4. 33% of students attained an ATAR over 90
- 5. 100% of Mathematics Ext1 students received an E4, equivalent to a Band 6.
- 6. English ESL had almost four times the number of Band 6's compared to the state.
- 7. Chinese Background Speakers and Japanese Beginners had almost three times the number of Band 6's compared to the state.
- 8. Tang Thao Nguyen (Naomi) was ranked 2nd in Chinese Beginners.
- 9. 45% of courses were above the state mean: Chemistry, English, (ESL & Standard), Legal Studies, Maths (Ex1), PDHPE, Physics, Chinese Background Speakers and Japanese Beginners.
- 10. Macquarie Grammar School was ranked higher than: St Andrew's Cathedral School, Trinity Grammar School, Newington College, The International Grammar School, St Vincent's College, Waverley College, St Luke's Grammar School, Macquarie Fields Selective School, St Patrick's College Strathfield and Inaburra School, to name a few.

Another outstanding achievement is Tang Thao Nguyen (Naomi) was awarded a Scholarship to study at the University of Technology Sydney. In the next edition of Bluey, there will be an article on where our students have articulated to tertiary studies in 2016.

Congratulations to the parents/guardians and teachers for working in partnership with the students to attain these exceptional results. It highlights the encouraging and wellsupported environment that exists at Macquarie Grammar School and in the home. The school is fortunate to have such a unique school culture that brings out the very best in our students.

School Uniform
