

Skoolbag is a mobile App for Macquarie Grammar School to communicate directly to parents, staff and students.



As a part of their study of

Mathematics Faculty

Seems like yesterday was the first day of school and yet another term has gone. As the calendar page turned to April, I started doing the usual end of term clean-up and found a couple of posters claiming 'Economics Is Where the Money Is' and 'Do Mathematics and You Can Do Anything'.

The juxtaposition of these messages perhaps signals a need to revisit cross-curricular teaching in education in a similar manner to society's review of multiculturalism in our National and International communities. It also reminded me of an old question: Where Does Mathematics Belong?

Teachers may have become increasingly comfortable with, and committed to, literacy across the curriculum; recognising the value of the symbiotic relationship. Have students too? George Polya, the greatest problem solver of the twentieth century, said that not only do we have to use our heads to do mathematics.but we need to do mathematics to learn to use our heads. To what extent do students recognise mathematics in their learning area? To answer this we should be looking a little further than everyday mathematics and numeracy as a requisite of our request to students to "Turn to page 24"! Some students may well be thinking that all that algebra stuff is not for them. Gattegno captured the heart of the issue when he said 'Abstraction makes life easy, makes it possible'. Language is conveniently vague so that the word car, for example, could cover all cars, not just one. Algebra is an attribute, a fundamental power of the mind.



Whenever you have quantification, measurement, pattern identification and extrapolation, the idea of distribution and

error, you have mathematics. Appreciation of number, algebraic reasoning, geometric thinking, statistical literacy and probabilistic understanding underpin all fields of endeavour and thus learning areas.

Year 12 students have now already started their campaign towards the HSC in October and again some excelled themselves in their attempt to raise their standards in Maths and that will definitely be reflected in their final results. We wish them well in this most important year. The annual event Talented Students Day will give our top senior students the opportunity to participate in a very rewarding experience along with likeminded students from other schools. It is a challenging and intellectually stimulating occasion for students who are exposed to areas of mathematics, which they may not have met previously.

Autumn Term (Term 2) will find our Years 7 and 9 students sitting the NAPLAN test in May and the assessment results will provide valuable information and assist the school in planning and will be used to support our teaching and learning programs. Once again, we expect the results to confirm students' achievements in numeracy and place our school again well above the state average.

Also, for those bright students who are really passionate about Maths we will continue to challenge them and get them ready for the two major competitions held in August: AMC and ICAS Mathematics. The questions will be provided via Edmodo in our internal competition "Matemagicians Corner". The Schools' Sharemarket Game had its first round this year starting in March and some of our Year 9 students Hayden, Leighton and Nick were very active and enjoyed taking some profits. Leighton also participated in Computational and Algorithmic Thinking 2016 Competition, which gave him the opportunity to demonstrate his computer programming potential.

I hope everyone will have a safe and relaxing holiday.


Here is a puzzle to enjoy over the holydays:
