

School Uniform

Introduction

Every student at Macquarie Grammar School must wear the officially approved school uniform with the mandatory blue blazer. In support of every student's welfare and safety while travelling to and from school, s/he will be clearly identified by the full school uniform. The Board of Directors sets the uniform and the PEO/Headmaster and staff are required to enforce it. The school seeks the co-operation of parents/guardians in maintaining a high standard of neatness and conformity with the school uniform, as well as in general appearance. Items must be official Macquarie Grammar School wear.

Wearing of Uniform between School and Home

MGS is proud of its image in the community and an important part of this pride is the full uniform. Therefore, all students will wear the full school uniform, including appropriate shoes, school shirts, vest or jackets according to the season. Non-regulation jackets and pants are not permitted. Appropriate shoes must always be worn to and from school and in the school, except when actively playing sport or practical P.E., where appropriate sports shoes are worn and permitted that support the ankle and foot. Sports shoes are only to be worn whilst playing sport. Years 7 to 10 wear the full school uniform including the blazer from Monday to Wednesday and Friday. The full sports uniform including the tracksuit is worn every Thursday and when a practical PDHPE lesson is held. Years 11 and 12 wear the full school uniform including the blazer from Monday to Friday. The school uniform is always worn to and from home.

Please make sure that you are in full school uniform or sports uniform at all the time during school hours from Monday to Friday. All the items are available online (except the school shoes), https://schoolshopnew.midford.com.au/macquariegrammar/customer/account/login

- The school hat or cap should be worn by students in PE outside activities. No other cap or hats are permitted.
- Some sports have a specific uniform check with your PDHPE teacher for details Proper Attire
- The Macquarie Grammar School blazer is worn with the Macquarie Grammar School shirt, the school tie and navy-blue school pants
- Students should wear the tie with the MGS school shirt (long and short sleeved) with or without the vest. The tie is not to be worn with the polo shirt. The tie is always to be worn appropriately knotted.
- A non-school blazer is not permitted to be worn at school or to or from school.
- A plain white or navy-blue T-shirt may be worn only under Macquarie Grammar School shirts of the same colour.

Extras

Jewellery, facial and body piercings must be minimal in appearance and non-offensive. It must not pose danger to injury through sport or excursions. Make up is only to be worn in moderation.

Clothing and jewellery are to be non-offensive, non-provocative, and non-discriminatory; no overt displays of spiritual, religious or other beliefs.

Consequences of Non-Compliance

Students out of uniform, who have the items at school, are required to change and are given detention. Students out of full uniform who do not have the items at school will be managed as follows:

Students in Year 10 will be sent home to change their clothes, following contact with their parent/caregiver. If we are unable to contact parents, the procedure as above will apply.

Students in Years 11 and 12 will be sent home to change. Enquiries should be directed to the Director of Welfare and Operations or the Director of Curriculum and Compliance.
