Message from the Headmaster

Assessments and Examinations

Our students have been working diligently with their teachers covering the content in each of their courses for the upcoming Summer Term Examinations. Both Years 11 and 12 students will be undertaking their up-coming examinations under the same conditions as the Higher School Certificate. Since this initiative has been introduced, the students' results have improved, and they have been less anxious in undertaking formal examinations. I wish the students well with their assessments and their first examinations for the new academic year.

Health and Hygiene Practices

The Coronavirus has been a major talking point amongst all of us, as things have been unfolding overseas over the past three (3) months, with the initial outbreak in China and now it has spread worldwide. The school has taken this current crisis seriously and I would like to assure parents, guardians, students and staff that we are in communication with NSW Health, the NSW Department of Education and the Federal and state Governments. As an announcement is made by these statutory bodies the school implements their recommendations. Currently the school has implemented the following strategies below to minimise the impact of the Coronavirus and up to now we have been free of the virus.

- 1. Students should keep their distance when speaking with other students and if possible, sit at separate desks in class or during their study periods.
- 2. Students must cover their mouth with a tissue when coughing and their nose when sneezing.
- 3. Wash their hands regularly with soap for up to 20 seconds.
- 4. Sanitiser dispensers are available for students and staff to access in the communal areas.
- 5. Avoid making contact with other students eg: shaking hands or sharing pens or stationery.

Signs have been placed around the school emphasising these procedures and it has been communicated to students to make sure they follow these practices.

Government Update and the School's Response

There has been a great deal of discussion if schools should close, but the Federal and State Governments have resisted taking this option for the following reasons, at least for now, but it is reviewing the situation daily.

- If schools close, parents will be required to make arrangements to look after their children and this may require them to stay at home. Many parents are nurses, aged care workers, emergency services employees, etc and they are currently required to be at work to support those who are vulnerable to this insidious virus.
- 2. There will be a huge financial impost upon the national economy, and this will lead to many people being unemployed.
- 3. And the young seem to be far less affected by this virus, than other age groups.

In Singapore schools have remained open and they have managed to control the spread of the virus quite well and this has been closely monitored by governments around the world including our own. Hopefully, with good management the virus will be controlled, but if the situation escalates, then the authorities may consider closing schools. Macquarie Grammar School will then revert to using an online method of delivery for students to continue with their studies, in particular Years 11 and 12. This will be a combination of using Edmodo and Microsoft Teams. Further information will be provided by the school, if school closures eventuate.

I urge parents and guardians to be cautiously concerned about the current situation but please be assured that Macquarie Grammar School cares for your child, our staff and our families, and is constantly reviewing our practices and procedures. Therefore, MGS in open as usual, conducting classes for our students.

Building a Productive and Positive Learning Environment

Positive, productive learning environments are key to the students' academic, emotional and social success in school. Unfortunately, positive learning environments don't just happen on their own—they must be created. There are many components that go into making a positive learning environment for students.

The best time to start developing a positive learning environment for our students is in their classroom during the first term of the school year, but it's never too late to get started. I want to explore positive action, and several simple tips, that teachers and even parents, can use for creating a positive, productive learning environment for students. By implementing these steps, we'll be able combine the need for positive learning environments that foster improved academic performance, with the ability to promote students' social and emotional wellbeing and progress inside and outside the classroom.

Help Students Develop Intrinsic Motivation



Feeling good about themselves is an intrinsic motivator to students and positive actions help students feel good about themselves. So, how do we help students consistently engage in positive actions? First, actions are always preceded by thoughts. Second, actions and behaviours are typically consistent with thoughts. Third, feelings, students experience about themselves, are based in large part by their actions. Helping students learn that by changing a negative thought to a positive they can produce positive actions, and that positive actions will help them feel good about themselves is a powerful intrinsic motivator.

Reinforce Positive Behaviours

Recognizing and reinforcing positive behaviours is one of the most effective ways to produce positive actions in students, strengthen intrinsic motivation, and create a productive and positive learning environment. Certificates and other reward systems are great ways to recognize students and reinforce positive behaviour and achievement in school. However, it's also important to help student make the connection between positive behaviour and the good feeling it produces. As students make that connection between positive behaviour and good feelings, and continue producing positive actions, they'll feel good about themselves, the intrinsic motivation is strengthened, and students will continue producing more positive actions and exhibiting positive behaviours.

Always Respond with Positivity

Positivity is a key component a positive learning environment. Interacting with students in a positive manner, exhibiting positive behaviours, and maintaining a positive attitude is one of the most important steps for creating a positive learning environment and producing successful students. Regardless of the situation or circumstance, there is always a way to respond to and interact with students in a positive way. As teachers we are teaching students how to communicate and interact with each other in a positive manner is also key to

fostering a positive learning environment in the classroom. Positivity is one of the most powerful agents of change for establishing and maintaining a positive learning environment at school and in the classroom.

Focus on the Positive

Each day we find something good in each student and point it out to them. Focusing on the positive in every student will enable us to create and maintain a truly positive learning environment for our students. And more importantly, we'll help each student build self-esteem and self-worth that will last a lifetime for them.

MGS SRC is raising funds to adopt a Koala/s from Port Macquarie Koala Hospital. All money raised will help to save our koalas.



As a response to the devastation that the recent bushfires have particularly caused. focussing on the impact on our wildlife, the SRC decided to raise funds to help Australian koalas. All MGS students donated money and helped to raise more funds through a cake sale. The SRC is proud to

announce that we have raised enough money to adopt 9 koalas from the Port Macquarie Koala Hospital. We thank all students and staff for their support to make this possible.



We adopted Paul, Anwen, Leo, Mini, Jimmy, Twinkles, Jones, Allen and Mary.

Paul and Anwen, are burn victims rescued from the firegrounds at Lake Innes Nature Reserve. Lion Leo is being treated for lacerations to his foot and has amazing blue eyes, which is a rare genetic phenomenon. Balmoral Mini and Crescent Head Jimmy are rescued joeys whose mothers died from extensive injuries. Oxley Twinkles was rescued with her mother. Byabarra Jones does not have enough vision to allow



him to survive in the wild. Guyra Allen and Emerald Downs Mary are completely blind and will stay at the hospital as teaching animals to show veterinarians, wildlife carers and researchers. The adoption of these koalas helps with the rescue and treatment of sick and injured koalas and with the release back to their home range where possible. The adoption also assists with the conservation and expansion of habitat, collection of information for research relating to habitat, disease, nutrition and habits of wild koalas.
