Are You Getting Enough Sleep?

Sleep is vital for normal daily functioning. Insufficient sleep leads to decreased motivation, sleepiness during the day, irritability, low tolerance levels, difficulties in focusing attention, and difficulties with self-control. Adequate sleep is vital for effective learning.

Sleep is a very topical subject with approximately 30% of primary school children and 70% of teenagers being sleep deprived. This is having significant consequences on many areas of their lives.

I would encourage students, guardians and parents to create an awareness of the current level of sleep deprivation among students and empowering parents with the knowledge and practical strategies and tools to manage sleep health for all members of their family.

Student Attendance

An important legal requirement of all schools is to maintain accurate attendance records. The recording system and processes at the school allows us to know whether students are at school or not and assists us in ensuring the safety of all students. The school records the daily attendance of all students at the start of every day and is completed by their class teachers at 8:00am (Period one) or 9:00am (Period 2) and 8.45am by their Tutor Group Teachers. To ensure we are able to account for every student, we require the parents or guardians of students who will be absent, to either call the School Office (8228 3022) by 8:30 am, or email

sso@mgs.edu.au where the SSO (Student Service Officer) will record the absence. If the school has not been notified by 9:00 am, the SSO will begin to contact the student's parents or guardians of any student who is absent. All absences require a written explanation or a Medical Certificate detailing the reason for the absence. This should be provided to the SSO the day after the absence. Reasons for absences are recorded on the Denbigh system.
