Message from the Headmaster

Spring Term Challenges

Spring Term 4 commenced with a staggered return to school for our students with Year 12 returning to face-to-face lessons first, followed by Years 7 to 11 the following week. This was a challenge for our teachers as they had Year 12 in the classroom teaching face-to-face while Years 7 to 11 were online. Our teachers adapted to the challenge and seamlessly transitioned from online teaching to face-to-face teaching and the students welcomed the return to school, with joy. The professionalism shown by our teachers was exceptional and I thank them for their good work while the students were online for all of Winter Term and into Spring Term. The lessons were creative and engaging and the curriculum was taught as per the programmes. In particular Year 12, who completed their courses and were well prepared for their Higher School Certificate Examinations. The Higher School Certificate Examinations commenced in Week 4 and were completed by Friday 3rd December. Year 11 sat for their Semester Two (2) Examinations and Years 7 to 10 completed their Spring Term Assessments last week, finalising their overall performance for the academic year. I wish all the students all the very best in receiving their academic results and look forward to reading their final reports.

Due to the COVID – 19 pandemic the normal school routine in Spring Term was suspended such as full school term and weekly assemblies, excursions, incursions and daily outings for lessons. Students were restricted to working and studying in their year groups and COVID safety guidelines were implemented, which included wearing a mask, socially distancing and regular hand sanitising. Even though these imposts were in place the students have enjoyed returning to school and have grasped the changes very well. I am proud of them in the way they have continued with their life at school and they have shown a level of maturity that is exemplary in every instance.

I would like to thank everyone within our school community for your patience and understanding with all the announcements throughout the year from the various authorities, that led to regular operational changes and in turn, created some uncertainty, as to when our students would return to school safely. Spring Term 4 Reports

Reports will be issued to students on the last day of Spring Term, on Wednesday 8th December after the Graduation Presentation and will be posted and emailed to parents and guardians. If you haven't received your child's report over the break, please contact the Student Services Officers. The Years 7 to 10 Reports will indicate your child's performance for Term 4 and for Year 11, it will be the final result for the Preliminary Course.

Graduation Day Wednesday 8th December, 2021

Traditionally a whole school Graduation Assembly is held the day after lessons conclude for Spring Term, which will take place this Wednesday 8th December at 9:00am. The students will be acknowledged for their achievements throughout the year with a Graduation Presentation that will take place within each Tutor Group. Awards will be presented in a number of categories which include, Academic Excellence, Consistent Effort, Meritorious Award, Sporting, Senior School Dux and Junior School Dux, etc. At the conclusion of each Tutor Group Presentation, the students will be released from school to commence their end of year break. I ask parents and guardians to make suitable arrangements for their child's supervision and for their return home. The students will have a staggered departure between 9:15am to 10:00am.

It is compulsory for all students to attend in full school uniform including their blazer and be at school by 8:45am. By implementing the NSW Health Department Guidelines, the Graduation Day Programme will be for the students and teachers only. The school will take photos of the students receiving their awards and will be posted online on the school's FACEBOOK page, for all to view and share in memory.

The school posts a calendar on the school's website in advance for three consecutive years, to give some idea to our international parents as to what the school has planned as the commencement and concluding dates for the four terms in each year. Please be aware that these dates may change and it's important that parents, guardians and students confirm the dates with the Headmaster prior to making any arrangements with family.

It is important to note that applications to the Headmaster for extended student absence outside of school holidays (during term lessons) will not be approved. Under the NSW Department of Education guidelines, the Headmaster may approve an exemption in exceptional circumstances only, but not for a holiday.

Due to health guidelines the Year 12 Vale took place within the Year 12 Tutor Group and was telecast via ZOOM to all our parents. 
Mrs Lee joined the school as an English Teacher at the beginning of Spring Term and has been a wonderful asset to the school.

All staff use the school QR code to check in and follow the School's Covid Safety Plan. The Covid Safety Guidelines are followed by everyone on site and students and staff wear face masks. - Hand sanitiser is made readily available in all classrooms and open areas.


Student Reports

Misheel Gansukh (Yr 7):


