Dear Students, Parents, and Guardians,

Welcome to the highlights of Term 2 at our school. It has been a dynamic and productive term filled with exciting activities and focused academic pursuits.

Student well being and developing good habits

We are committed to promoting the well-being of our students by guiding them in building a sense of positivity and resilience. Our students must interact respectfully and graciously with each other as members of the Macquarie Grammar School community. We encourage parents/guardians to work with us to emphasize the importance of healthy habits, respectful interactions, and a growth mindset to our students.

Our students need to use their mobile devices and Personal Learning Devices responsibly. We want to emphasize that teachers expect students to keep their mobile phones away during curriculum time and other school activities. Any use during these times must have explicit permission from the teacher in charge. Additionally, Personal Learning Devices should only be used for learning purposes. We've stressed to our students that mobile devices and Personal Learning Devices should not be used for inappropriate activities. We will continue to educate our students to be safe and responsible users of technology and would like to work closely with parents/guardians to manage device usage.

The digital environment is a significant part of our students' lives. As a school, we strive to create a positive learning environment and encourage all our students to be positive peer influences. We ask for support and assistance from parents/guardians to actively supervise and monitor their children's use of mobile devices and online platforms to ensure that they are used in a meaningful and healthy manner.

Digital Literacy Initiatives: Optus Digital Workshops

Ms Ryan from Optus conducted enlightening Digital Workshops aimed at enhancing students' digital literacy across all year levels:

- Digital Balance Workshop:

Students in Years 11 and 12 explored strategies for maintaining a healthy balance between online activities and offline responsibilities. The workshop emphasised time management techniques and the importance of mindful use of digital devices.

- Digital Discernment Workshop:

Year 10 students engaged in discussions on identifying reliable sources of information online. They learned critical thinking skills to evaluate the credibility of digital content, essential for navigating today's information rich environment.

- Cyber Security Workshop:

Separate sessions were held for students in Years 7, 8, 9, and HSP, focusing on practical strategies to enhance online safety. Topics included safeguarding personal information, recognising cyber threats, and understanding the importance of strong passwords and privacy settings.

These workshops were instrumental in equipping our students with essential skills to navigate the digital world safely and responsibly. Ms Ryan's expertise and engaging approach ensured that students gained practical knowledge they could apply in their everyday lives.

Attendance and punctuality

HSC Study Skills Workshops and Academic Support

In the Language faculty, Year 12 students enrolled in Chinese and Japanese language courses participated in dedicated HSC Study Skills Workshops. These workshops focused on familiarising students with exam techniques, including tackling different question types and refining their exam strategies to achieve high band results.

Students engaged in rigorous practice sessions and received personalised feedback to strengthen their proficiency in both languages. These efforts are aimed at equipping our students with the confidence and skills necessary to excel in their upcoming Trial and HSC exams.

Science Experiments: UTS Science Excursion

Accompanied by expert instructors, they gained valuable insights into scientific methodologies and explored various scientific concepts in a practical setting. 



Alphonse Mucha (1860–1939) created some of the most instantly recognisable and best-loved works in modern European art and developed a new look in Paris that defined the late 1800s.

The Archibald Prize is a contemporary Australian art competition which is held annually at the Art Gallery of NSW, and is seen as the most prestigious portrait prize in Australia.


